

Welcome to Summer Reading 2021! Sign up begins June 14th and runs through July 31st. Come to the library on June 14th and go to the table that coincides with the grade that your child is going into in September. Someone will add your child's name and age to the sign-up sheet. Your child will be given a bag containing materials they will need for a successful reading experience. Minutes that your child reads will be recorded and verified by a parent.

READING REQUIREMENTS:

GREEN Preschool through 1st grade must be read to/or read 13 hours BLUE 2nd grade through 5th grade must read 17 hours ORANGE 6th through 8th grade must read 21 hours

YELLOW 9th through 12th grade must read 28 hours

<u>August 2nd - 14th</u> reading sheets with required hours listed, totaled and signed for verification, may be turned in. He/she will receive a bag filled with a book, coupons and several miscellaneous prizes.

- Every week except the first, each child will receive 1 or 2 crafts to bring home.
- Most of the programs will be held outside. If we have inclement weather, the program will be canceled and we'll send out a notification via Facebook or our website.

- Any time after July 6, you may come in to sign up for the Grand Prize.
 There is only one winner throughout the cooperative. You could win a shopping spree at the Great Lakes Crossings Outlet Mall and a membership to John Ball Zoo.
- For the pet show on July 8th at 11:00am, please register your pet at the pavilion in the park upon arrival. Instructions will follow.
